I. When our school opened last April there were 420 pupils which was 80% of the number enrolled last year. How many were in our school last year?

Solution:- Since 420 pupils is 80% of the whole, the whole number of pupils will be as many as  $420 \div .80 = 525$  pupils

II. Mr Allen Dale owns a farm and sells 25% of his share for \$1246.50. What was the value of the farm?

Solution:- Since 25% of the farm equal \$1246.50 the value of the whole farm will be as many as  $\$1246.50 \div 25\% = 4986$  the whole farm.

III.

A grocer bought 100 eggs at .15 a dozen, but 16 of them proved bad, and he sold the rest @ .18 per doz. How much percent did he gain?

Solution:— If in one doz. there are 12 eggs in 100 there are as many as  $100 \div 12 = 8\frac{2}{3}$  doz. and if one doz. cost .15,  $8\frac{2}{3}$  will cost as much as  $.15 \times 8\frac{2}{3} = \$1.26$  and if 16 of them proved bad he had left the difference between  $100 - 16 = 84$  which is 7 dozens. he sold them at .18 a doz.  $\times 7 = \$1.26$ . he gain the difference between  $\$1.26 - \$1.25 = .01$  being the .8% Gain.

How many sq. yds. on the walls of a room 12 ft. 6 in. square and 9 ft. 3 in. high, allowing for 2 windows and one door, each 6 ft. 2 in. high and 2 ft. 4 in. wide.

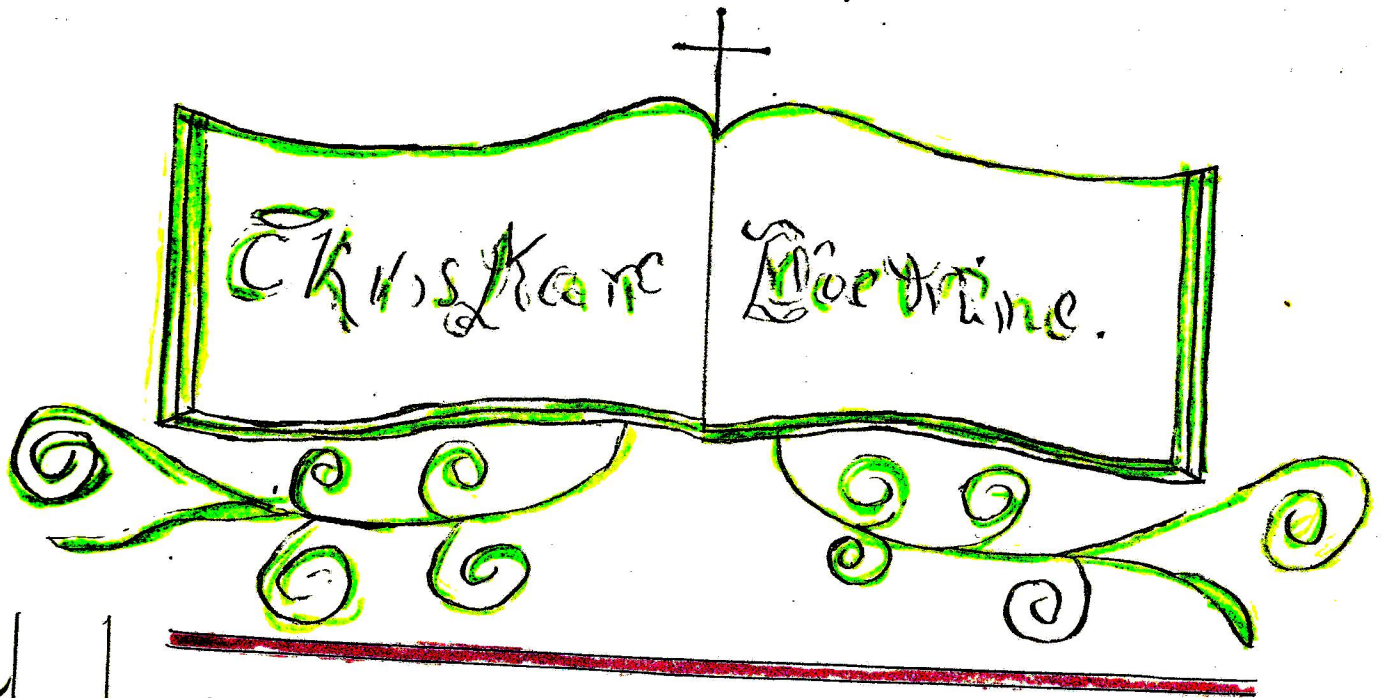
$$12\frac{1}{2} + 12\frac{1}{2} + 12\frac{1}{2} + 12\frac{1}{2} = 50 \text{ ft distance round room}$$

$$50 \text{ ft} \times 9\frac{3}{4} = 462\frac{1}{2} \text{ sq. ft. on the walls.}$$

$$6\frac{1}{6} \times 2\frac{2}{3} = 14\frac{7}{18} \times 3 = 43\frac{1}{6} \text{ sq. ft. in 1 door + two windows.}$$

$$462\frac{1}{2} - 43\frac{1}{6} = 419\frac{1}{3} \text{ sq. ft.}$$

$$419\frac{1}{3} \div 9 = 46\frac{11}{27} \text{ sq. yds.}$$

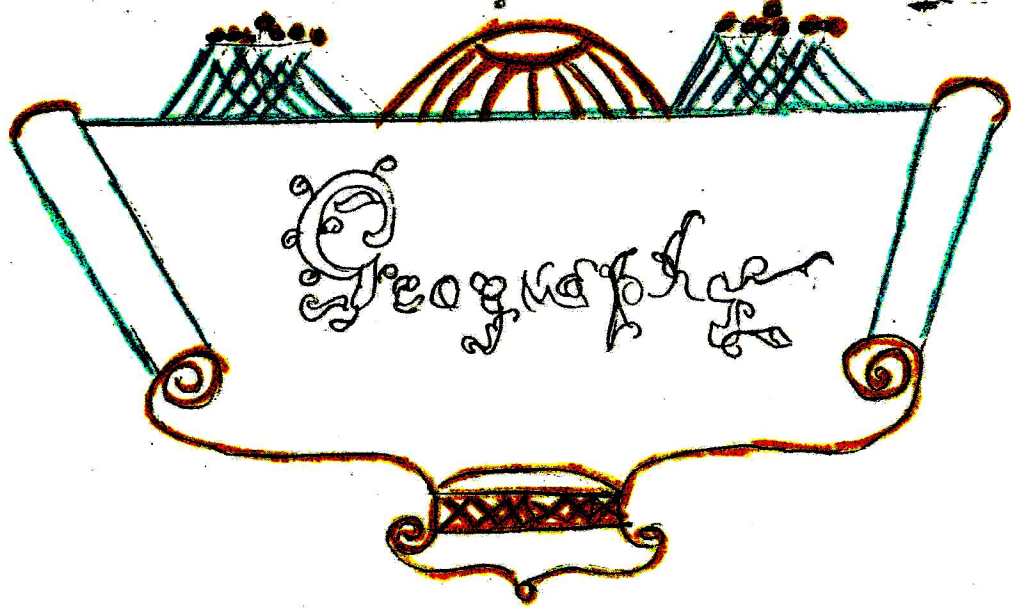

The words I and O should always be capitals.

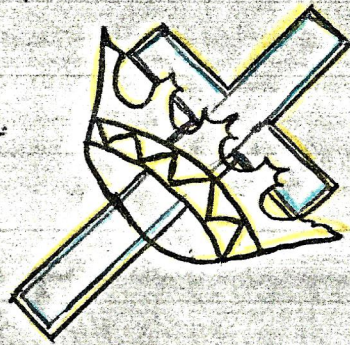
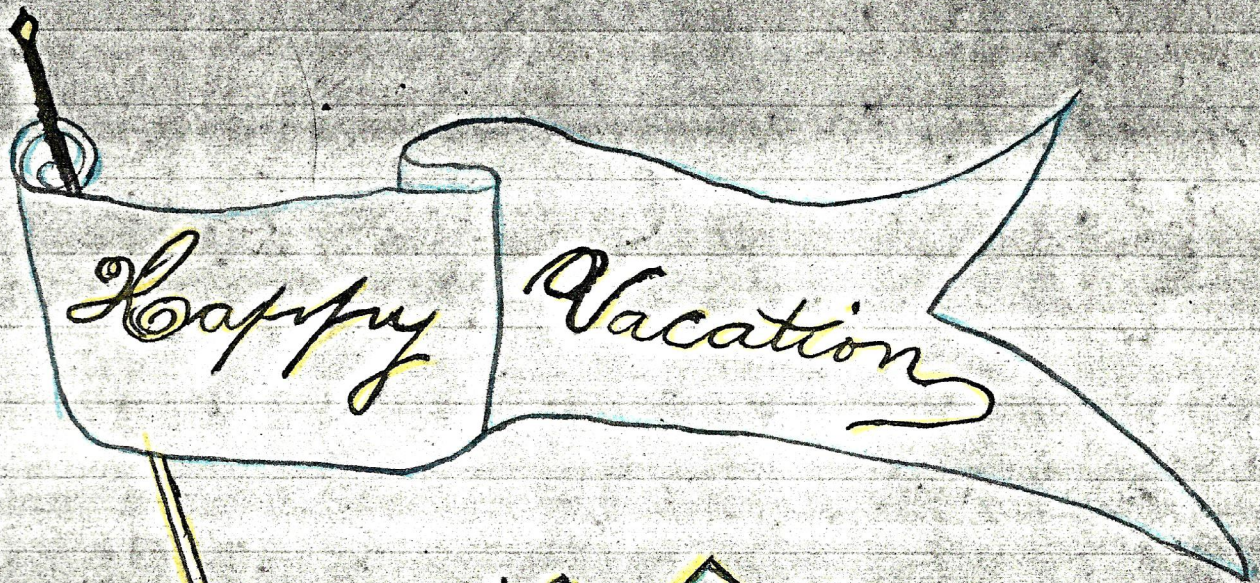

One of the great glories of our dear "Green Mountain State" is that it was for many years the home of one of the greatest heroes of the Revolution. viz. General Ethan Allen the hero of Ticonderoga. It was just at this period that the American colonists were engaged in the great struggle for independence, and Ethan Allen threw himself heart and soul into the strife after the famous minute men sounded the war cry at Lexington we find him and his company of "Green Mountain

tains boys demanding the surrender of Fort Ticonderoga. Soon after in an attempt to conquer Montreal he was taken prisoner and sent to England in irons and after a long captivity being released, he returned to his ho.

His remains are entered in Green Mountain Cemetery in Burlington Vt. Fort Ethan Allen near his old home in Winooski, recalls to us his famous deeds. Fannie Allen Hospital is named after his daughter who became a convert to the Catholic faith and died a Sister of St. Joseph's in Montreal.
