

Body of Veteran, Donald Bombardier, Arriving Tuesday

The body of Sgt. Donald A. Bombardier, killed in action July 27, 1944, in St. Lo, France, will arrive in Burlington at 3:45 Tuesday afternoon.

Sgt. Bombardier, son of Mrs. Lucy R. Bombardier, 81 Walnut st., and the late Arthur M. Bombardier, entered the army May 13, 1942, and served in the 29th Infantry, 115th Division. He received the EAME, good conduct and infantry combat medals and was posthumously awarded the purple heart and bronze star.

He was a member of the League of the Sacred Heart of St. Joseph's Church, Howard Plant Post No. 782, VFW, and the American Legion Bugle and Drum Corps.

Besides his mother, he is survived by two sisters, Mrs. Marie Kranak, Granville, N. Y., and Miss Thelma Bombardier, Burlington; one half brother, John J. Marley, Burlington; and two nephews, Arthur and Donald Kranak.

The body will be met at the train by the 29th Infantry veterans. Any such men are asked to contact William Centerbar, Jr., telephone 4536-W, who will make arrangements for the veterans to meet the train and act as honorary bearers.

Funeral services will be held Wednesday morning at 9 in St. Joseph's Church, with burial in Mt. Calvary Cemetery. The VFW will provide military honors. Until the hour of the services, the body will be at the Fred'k J. Boucher Funeral Home, 68 Elmwood ave.
