

Pvt. Harold Provost Is Killed in Action

Private Harold Fabian Provost, 22, was killed in action June 23, in France according to a war department telegram received Wednesday night by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Albert R. Provost, 180 North Willard st. The telegram said details of his death would follow. Private Provost had been engaged to marry Miss Norma Shortsleeve, North Winooski ave.

He was born here May 20, 1922. He was a member of the Howard Plant Post, VFW, and prior to his entry into the service, Nov. 25, 1942, was employed with the E. B. and A. C. Whiting company. He received his basic training at Camp Blanding, Fla. He was stationed at Camp Atterbury, Ind., and Camp Forrest, Tenn., before being sent overseas last Jan.

Besides his parents, he leaves, two sisters, Mrs. Delores Morette and Miss Iris Provost; also seven brothers, Bernard, Stuart, Allen, Donald, Arnold, Kenneth and Marshall, all of Burlington.
