

Raymond McMillan Killed in Action

Edward McMillan, Father, Gets Wire

Pfc. Raymond H. McMillan, BHS '42 and a former American Woolen Co. employe, was killed in action March 15, 1945, on Luzon, according to a telegram received by his father, Edward P. McMillan, 69 Walnut st., last night from the war department.

Born Aug. 11, 1925, Pfc. McMillan entered the service Feb. 16, 1943, as a selectee, served at Camp Swift, Tex., Fort Leonard Wood, Mo., at Shreveport, La., Fort Ord, Calif. and went overseas last July. He was on the Hawaiian Islands, at Oahu, before going into action on Luzon.

Besides his father, he leaves a brother, Private James McMillan, now overseas, a brother, Private Roy, in New Guinea, and a brother, Walter, of Burlington. He was a graduate of Nazareth school.

Memorial services will be held Saturday morning at 8 in St. Joseph's church.
