

Wilfred Provost Killed in Action

**Burlington Man Died
In Germany Dec. 6**

Private Wilfred N. Provost, 37, (shown here, son of Mrs. Rose Alma Provost, 14 Johnson st., was reported killed in action in Germany Dec. 6, according to word received from the war department. He had previously been reported missing in action from that date.



He was serving with an infantry division of the third army.

Private Provost was inducted in March, 1943, and was sent overseas in Dec., of that year. He saw service in England, France and Germany.

He is survived by three children, George, Jacqueline and Wilfred, Jr. Also surviving are his mother, and five brothers, Sgt. Albert C. Provost, with the army intelligence in Belgium; Private Eugene H. Provost, Johnstown, Pa.; Corp. Raymond R. Provost, with the ordnance corps in France; Sgt. Joseph H. Provost, with the medical detachment based in England; and Seaman 2-C Henry P. Provost, serving with the Pacific fleet; and five sisters, Mrs. Clement Martin, Mrs. Adrian E. Simays, Mrs. Herschel Cross, Miss Claire Provost, all of Burlington; and Mrs. Leo LeBlanc, Albany, N. Y.

Private Provost attended the Nazareth school and Cathedral high school, and prior to entering the service was employed with the Pratt and Whitney aircraft corporation, Hartford, Conn.
